
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Collegiate DECA

Collegiate DECA is an international organization for college students who are preparing for careers in, but not limited to, marketing, business, or management. Each of Collegiate DECA's local chapters and state associations are a division of National DECA, Inc.

Activities promoted by Collegiate DECA integrate and enhance the student's curriculum. In addition, the organization's close ties with the business community provide both professional opportunities for members and an appreciation for the American free enterprise system. Collegiate DECA membership is an essential resource for future success in customer service, strategic planning, business relations, and other "real world scenarios."

Members compete in state and international conferences, in fields relating to marketing, hospitality, tourism, business management, administration, finance,



category, individuals or teams chose their desired topic pertaining to their overall theme. Once at the competition, competitors are given a case study, in which they have a designated time to create a solution, business strategy, or proposal. After presenting their unique ideas to a judge, students have the opportunity to win medals and scholarships.

A Better Understanding of Our Chapter

Our University of Arizona DECA Chapter is an official Eller College of Management organization. Though there is a primary business focus, any student at the University of Arizona is more than welcomed to join our chapter. Beyond competitions, our club provides a wide range of activities for our students to participate in. Weekly meetings are hosted to continuously sculpt the minds of our scholars. We also schedule many socials, fundraisers, and volunteer events to maintain the bond between our chapter, our executive board, and our sponsors. We aspire to prepare our members with the best opportunities to succeed in competitions and conferences.

Fall Leadership Conference (FLC) – Phoenix, Arizona

Each year, students from the University of Arizona and surrounding colleges will compete in business related contests at the regional level of DECA. A school in Phoenix, in past years has been Arizona State University and Grand Canyon University, hosts the Fall Leadership Conference early in each November. This conference is an important part of the DECA chapter, as it allows students to represent the University of Arizona for the first time of that school year. The conferences help students to develop occupational competencies, presenting them skills to demonstrate knowledge of the business world. Also, all Arizona DECA Chapters perform in a mock competition to better understand what the state and international competition will be like later in the year.

Collegiate Leadership Academy (Engage) – New York City, New York

Following FLC, students are given the opportunity to travel to New York City, or another commonly known city, later in November. DECA members attend the Collegiate Leadership Academy, also referenced as Engage. This few day excursion gives students the chance to learn from leading professionals in their place of business. Past workshop hosts were representatives from Hilton, Men's Warehouse, M&M Productions USA, Marriott International, and other name brand companies. Participants will work with their chapters, as well as students from around the United States, to solve real world business situations to perfect their teamwork, trust, leadership, and professionalism. Students who have attended this event in the past walk away with valuable business skills that well-known companies around the world desire.

Arizona Career Development Conference (ACDC) – Phoenix, Arizona

Once students have experienced the previous conferences, they will officially compete their events at the Arizona Career Development Conference, which is our State Level Conference hosted by Arizona State University. ACDC falls towards the end of February each year. Here, competitors will present their business simulation or written event to judges, similar to the workshop hosts at Engage. Beside written events, students are not provided insight about their competition prior to their designated preparation time. Therefore, judges assess competitors ability of on-the-spot thinking, knowledge, and creativity. Following their presentations, students "learn from the pros," which gives the judges time to speak with all of the participants and suggest how to grow through improvement. There are also additional workshops and meetings, which are held by business professionals and student's peers, to further enhance each Arizona chapter's learning.

International Career Development Conference (ICDC) – Various Cities

After the Arizona Career Development Conference, students who place in the top

three will move on to the International conference during the middle of April.

This final conference is the highest competition a DECA chapter can reach. Due to the versatile attendance, the conference is never held in the same place, allowing students to experience new cities, climates, and cultures.

Previously, ICDC has been held in cities like Washington D.C., Anaheim, California, and Orlando, Florida. This last conference for the year is very similar to ACDC, in the regard of competition. If students make it to the finalist round, they will repeat the competition process with a more difficult case study. Awards range from Top 10 to 1st through 3rd place. Considering the popularity of this conference, it is an extreme accomplishment to be awarded at ICDC.
